

KING AND QUEEN OF IAD GUIDELINES

Objective

The granting of being King and Queen is a long-standing tradition of Iowa Association of the Deaf. It is intended to honor a man and a woman who have a sustained record of achievements of lasting significance to the Iowa Association of the Deaf.

Criteria

Persons nominated for consideration for being King and Queen of current Conference should have made distinguished and broad contributions to the organization. These may be in the traditional areas of volunteering service to the state of Iowa or to the Deaf community of Iowa.

It is desirable, but by no means required, that the person selected have had some affiliation with the Iowa Association of the Deaf.

Process

A hosting Conference committee is charged with the responsibility of soliciting and screening members for the title of King and Queen of IAD. If there is no hosting Conference committee, the current IAD Board will be charged with the responsibility of selecting certain members for the title of King and Queen of IAD.

The hosting Conference committee (or current IAD Board), based on the supporting rationale and any additional consultation, will select the male member and the female member to be King and Queen of the current IAD. Past Conference King and Queen will announce picking the male member and the female member to become King and Queen of current IAD during the Friday night or Saturday night Conference.
